

Watching Gender Survey

Methodology: This report examines parents' attitudes toward gender as it is reflected on television and in movies and uses data from a probability-based online survey of 933 parents of children age 2 to 17 living in the United States. It was administered by SSRS from March 28 to April 18, 2017. **www.ssrs.com**
