

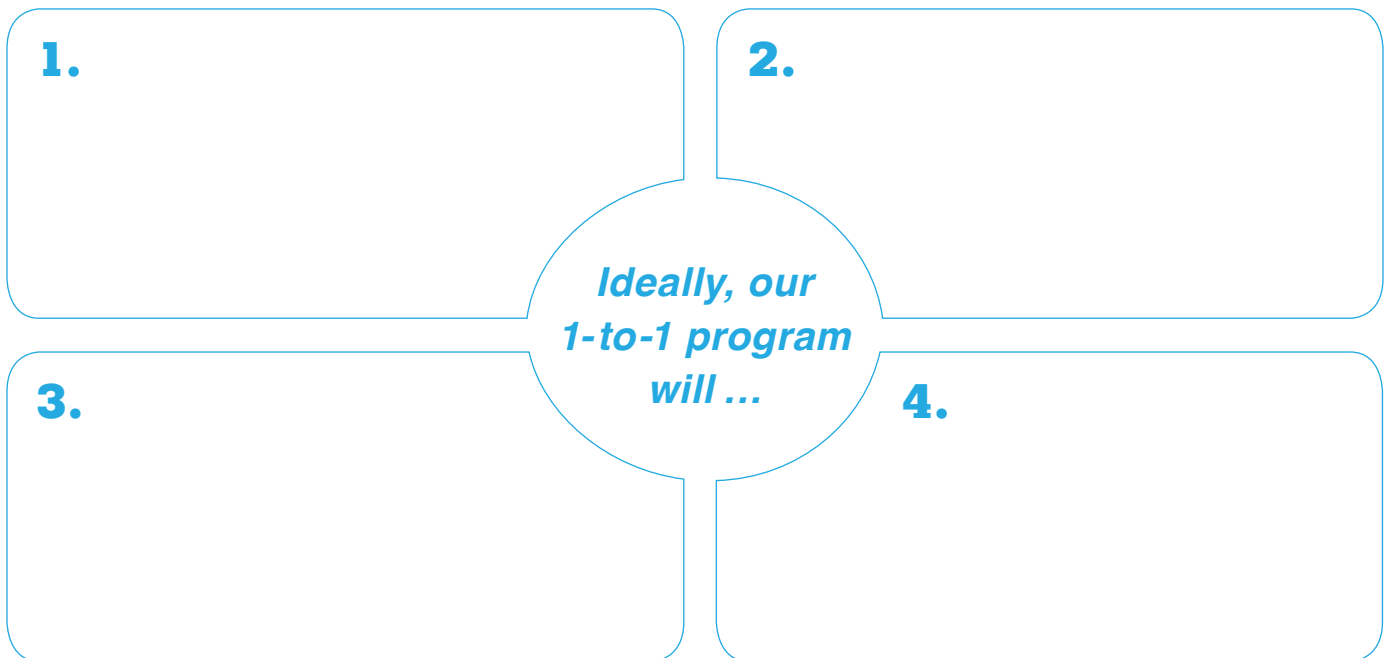


## Goal

To define your vision for and articulate the rationale behind your school's 1-to-1 program.

## Call to Action

Revisit your school's philosophy statement to articulate how your 1-to-1 program will enhance your educational mission. What educational goals do you have for your students? Imagine how students' learning environments might shift, the skills and competencies you want them to develop, and the impact your 1-to-1 program might have on your school climate.



### Survey

Survey the landscape. Assess your school's infrastructure, from the wiring to the personnel. Get a sense of your strengths and weaknesses from the get-go.

### Outline

Outline and rationalize your 1-to-1 program clearly. Articulate and address expectations for acceptable use and responsible behavior. Be proactive rather than reactive, and define the "why?" behind bringing technology into the classroom.
